I actually enjoyed going to services when I was a child. But to be honest, when I became a Rabbi, I had a hard time with communal prayer. Like so many other colleagues, I often have felt on display, watched and judged. Well intentioned remarks like, "You seem so into it tonight", make me feel self- conscious and unable to embrace worship as whole-heartedly as I once did as a boy.

But at Sha-arey Ha Yam its different. Yes, our small congregation lends itself to a more informal atmosphere. But most of all, its the people here that are simply appreciative of a Rabbi who works to prepare a thought-provoking talk, who aspires to lead each service with "ruach" (spirit), and who looks forward to making the 75 minute drive to share Shabbat with you.

I offer these thoughts not simply to express my appreciation, but also to encourage you to pray as passionately as you like, to get teary-eyed during the prayer for healing or Mourners Kaddish, to smile when it's time to share "simchahs", and to think about the Torah reading or sermon. So when we gather on Shabbat, feel free to wear a Tallit or Kippah, to sing loudly, to offer a question or comment, and to allow your Jewishness to flow without inhibition.
