

Message from the Rabbi

Next month, on Friday evening, April 5, our congregation will have the very great honor of being addressed by Rabbi Sally Priesand. Rabbi Priesand is, literally, a living legend – the first female ordained rabbi in America and the first woman in world history to serve as an ordained congregational rabbi. A modest, soft-spoken but at the same time dynamic and powerful woman, Rabbi Priesand has written: "When I decided to study for the rabbinate, I never thought much about being a pioneer, nor was it my intention to champion the rights of women. I just wanted to be a rabbi. On the whole, I'm a very private person," And yet it was Rabbi Priesand's determination and, yes, pioneering spirit that changed Judaism forever by opening the rabbinate to women – not just here in the United States but all over the world. Today, more than a thousand women have been ordained by the Reform, Conservative and Reconstructionist Movements; and even in the Orthodox world, progress in this area is slowly being made. How many people can truly look back at their lives and careers and say that they changed the world?

Born in 1946 in Cleveland, Ohio, Rabbi Priesand took an intense interest in Judaism from a young age. With neither institutional history nor support for such a daring notion, she became determined to become a rabbi, motivated simply from within her own soul and intellect. In her own words: "I decided I wanted to be a rabbi in 1962 at the age of 16. Fortunately, my parents gave me one of the greatest gifts a parent can give a child: the courage to dare and to dream. With their encouragement, I was able to remain focused on my goal, relatively unconcerned that no woman had ever been ordained rabbi by a theological seminary and determined to succeed despite the doubts I heard expressed in the organized Jewish community." Undeterred, Rabbi Priesand forged on, and on June 3, 1972, she was ordained a rabbi at the historic Plum Street Synagogue in Cincinnati. After her ordination, then member of Congress Bella Abzug arranged for her to deliver the opening prayer at the House of Representatives, being the first Jewish woman ever to do so.

We'll hear from Rabbi Priesand about just what it was like to be a woman in an historically all-men's institution, and in a millennia-old all-men's profession - where everything from restrooms to what it actually means to be a rabbi - had to be reconsidered and wrestled with simply because of her presence. After graduation, Rabbi Priesand served as an assistant rabbi at Stephen Wise Free Synagogue in Manhattan, leaving in 1979 when it became clear to her that she would not be promoted to succeed the ailing senior rabbi. Unable to find a full-time position, she then served as the part-time rabbi of Temple Beth El in Elizabeth, N.J., and as a chaplain at Lenox Hill Hospital in Manhattan from 1979 to 1981. Then she and Monmouth Reform Temple in Tinton Falls (just up the Parkway from us!) found each other. In a seemingly *beshert* ("meant to be") match, Rabbi Priesand and the congregation partnered together for the next 25 years ; she retired from full-time congregational work in 2006.

Pamela S. Nadell, a historian, has said that the first women to become rabbis were in a unique position to bring feminism to American Judaism. "They haven't been the innovators of Jewish feminism — that comes from theologians and scholars and poets" said, Dr. Nadell, "But they have disseminated those messages to their congregations because of their positions of leadership." Furthermore, says Dr. Nadell, women have helped

transform what it means to be a pulpit rabbi, empowering their congregants in ways that the old authoritarian model of the rabbinate did not permit. "They really believed they spoke in a different voice and that congregants related to them differently," she has written.

Traditionally, the typical trajectory for a (male) rabbi was to serve congregations of ever-increasing size. But the entrance of women into the rabbinate challenged that model. Women rabbis asked, "Why is size – that is, 'bigger -' the only way of measuring success? What about mutually rewarding relationships, building community, empowering lay people to grow Jewishly?" Following her historic ascendance into the rabbinate, most people expected Rabbi Priesand to follow the "bigger is better" model. But Rabbi Priesand chose to remain at Monmouth, creating an unusually close relationship with her congregation and offering both female and male rabbis an alternative model for success. In fact, Rabbi Priesand has said, "You know how I measure success? I ask myself, 'Am I doing better today than I did yesterday?' And if the answer is "yes," well then, I feel successful."

Despite having made great strides, many women rabbis still lag behind men in salary and benefits. And they are still outnumbered by men in the top positions within the Reform Movement's organizational structure. Still, said Rabbi Priesand, "Moses didn't get to go to the Promised Land, and it reminded me nobody ever gets to go to the Promised Land. You never accomplish everything that you want to accomplish. You do as much as you can to move things forward, and your consolation is knowing there's a Joshua to follow."

Since the 20th anniversary of Rabbi Priesand's ordination, the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion, which ordained her at its Cincinnati campus, has marked the anniversary at five-year intervals with academic conferences, an honorary doctorate of divinity and an endowed professorship named after her. Each year, the college includes her in its graduation class photo. She receives dozens of requests for private meetings annually, many from college students working on research papers. She is a much-sought after lecturer, teacher and consultant. It will, indeed, be an honor to welcome her to our community on April 5. Please mark your calendars and feel free to invite friends. It will be a very special evening.

In the Garden of Beasts: Love, Terror, and an

American Family in Hitler's Berlin By <u>Erik Larson</u> (Goodreads Author)

The time is 1933, the place, Berlin, when William E. Dodd becomes America's first ambassador to Hitler's Germany in a year that proved to be a turning point in history.

A mild-mannered professor from Chicago, Dodd brings along his wife, son, and flamboyant daughter, Martha. At first Martha is entranced by the parties and pomp, and the handsome young men of the Third Reich with their infectious enthusiasm for restoring Germany to a position of world prominence. Enamored of the "New Germany," she has one affair after another, including with the surprisingly honorable first chief of the Gestapo, Rudolf Diels. But as evidence of Jewish persecution mounts, confirmed by chilling first-person testimony, her father telegraphs his concerns to a largely indifferent State Department back home. Dodd watches with alarm as Jews are attacked, the press is censored, and drafts of frightening new laws begin to circulate. As that first year unfolds and the shadows deepen, the Dodds experience days full of excitement, intrigue, romance—and ultimately, horror, when a climactic spasm of violence and murder reveals Hitler's true character and ruthless ambition.

Suffused with the tense atmosphere of the period, and with unforgettable portraits of the bizarre Göring and the expectedly charming--yet wholly sinister--Goebbels, *In the Garden of Beasts* lends a stunning, eyewitness perspective on events as they unfold in real time, revealing an era of surprising nuance and complexity. The result is a dazzling, addictively readable work that speaks volumes about why the world did not recognize the grave threat posed by Hitler until Berlin, and Europe, were awash in blood and terror.(<u>less)</u>

PASSOVER FACTS

The World's Largest Passover Seder Takes Place in Nepal, of All Places. Each year members of the Chabad-Lubavitch movement hold their "Seder on Top of the World" in Kathmandu for Jewish locals and travelers alike (I'm gonna guess more the latter than the former). Last year they had around 2,000 people attend the festivities, and you can bet your tuchus that between the flowing wine and the thin air, it was quite the party.

Abraham Lincoln Was Assassinated During Passover. According to the American Jewish Historical Society, many Jews were in synagogue for the holiday when news of Lincoln's assassination broke. Altars in temples "were quickly draped in black and, instead of Passover melodies, the congregations chanted Yom Kippur hymns. Rabbis set aside their sermons and wept openly at their pulpits, as did their congregants." Sadly, a time that was supposed to be full of celebration became one of mourning.


HELP INCREASE Membership
