

Message From Rabbi Goldstein

Think of the Passover Seder as our opportunity to tell our stories. Our journey from degradation to dignity. One line from the Haggadah can trigger the recognition: "My Father was a wandering Armenian." Those few words can provoke a sacred moment when everyone at the table speaks of, or learns about, their personal histories. "Grandpa Joshua came to America from the Austro-Hungarian Empire before the Holocaust. He and his parents lived in a world that despised Jews, but they stayed true to their tradition. And long before that, my people broke the chains of 430 years of Egyptian slavery, inspired by faith and by the dream of returning to our homeland."

That's part of my story. Our story. Passover's story. And the telling of it at the Seder should evoke Jewish pride in each of us.

And, in a more contemporary sense, we might even speak of the metaphorical chains that kept us enslaved to different challenges (addictions, obsessions, job loss, broken families, illness, etc.) and how we've tried to heroically break through. Speak, too, of how we now live at the high point of Jewish history, when our homeland exists and thrives.

Now that's a Passover Seder that doesn't rely on gimmicks or time restraints, but does rely on a willingness to tell our Jewish stories. Through those stories we discover purpose and meaning as we annually re-embrace our remarkable history, and the forces that brought us to this season. Chag Sameach!

Back by popular demand.....here's a recipe for Passover Brownies.....

PASSOVER AWESOME BROWNIES

Ingredients

4 eggs

2 cups white sugar

1 cup unsalted butter, melted

6 TBS matzo cake meal

1 cup cocoa powder (Ghiardelli is best)

1 cup chopped walnuts or pecans (OPTIONAL)

**FROSTING

4 oz. Semi-sweet chocolate melted (either squares or chocolate chips)

1 TBS Crisco® melted

Instructions

Preheat oven to 350°. Line with aluminum foil and grease a 9" x 9" inch* baking pan. In a medium size mixing bowl, blend eggs, sugar and butter. Mix in matzo meal, cocoa powder and nuts. Transfer batter to prepared baking pan.

Bake for 35 minutes.*

For frosting, blend chocolate and Crisco® in microwaveable dish, slowly, until melted. Spread over COOLED brownies.

- *If you use an 8 x 8 pan it may seem to be very jiggly after 30 minutes. If it's VERY jiggly and a toothpick inserted in center is VERY wet, return to oven for about 5 minutes. It will still look not completely cooked, but it is and will set up nicely. You don't want to overcook these brownies.
- ** You can use the above recipe for a frosting on the completely cooled brownies OR you can use Duncan Hines icing and decorate each individual cut brownie. I use the vanilla and it tastes and looks great. ALSO it looks great to simply dust the brownies with confectioner's sugar AFTER they've been cut

NOTE: Brownies should be cooled before cutting into 2" pieces (2x2)
