Message from the Rabbi:

Dear Friends,

The services of the High Holy Days, which are almost upon us, are both eternal and new. That is, they encompass some of our most ancient liturgical texts, melodies and rituals while also lending themselves to new ways of expressing the themes of self-reflection, atonement, memory and renewal.

To that end, I want to share with you something new that we will be doing at Yizkoron Yom Kippur afternoon, a ritual that I hope you will find personally engaging and meaningful. We know that sense memories are very powerful; objects or even words we think through and write down sometimes help us "trigger" a depth of feeling and memory and assist us in our internal reflection and introspection. So this year, just before the start of the Yizkor service, we will place baskets on the altar table next to our ark. Just before the Yizkor prayer itself, we will invite anyone who would like to do so to come forward silently to place a note, an object, a photograph or letter, a stone, a piece of jewelry – that is, a memento, something that will trigger or help connect with the memory of a loved one. You can either leave the object there or retrieve them at the conclusion of Ne'ilah, before the break fast. If this ritual is something that you think you would like to do, please bring whatever item would mean something to you to the service.

We will have some other new rituals too: enrobing our Torah scrolls in white at the start of the erev (evening) Rosh Hashanah service, the use of large black and white candles to represent repentance and return — and more. Our wonderful choir, under the peerless direction of Philip Altland, is preparing both new and familiar music, and we are blessed this year to have the beautiful voice of our own Karen Kolb as soloist. We are also thrilled once again to have the beautiful musicianship of Stan Jackson on the clarinet.

We will symbolically cast off our sins together on Rosh Hashanah morning at the lake and acknowledge our sins and errors through the writing of a personal "Vidui" or confessional on Kol Nidrei. All in all, I believe we will offer a Days of Repentance experience that will challenge, comfort, inspire and enrich you. I so look forward to spending these awe-filled days with you.

Book Review

<u>The Age of Insight: The Quest to Understand the Unconscious in Art, Mind, and Brain</u> ... From Vienna 1900 to the Present by Eric R. Kandel

P. 307: "memory is the glue that binds out mental life together, whether in our response to art or to other events in our life. We are who we are in large part because of what we learn and what we remember."

The Age of Insight takes us to Vienna 1900, where leaders in science, medicine, and art began a revolution that changed forever how we think about the human mind—our conscious and unconscious thoughts and emotions—and how mind and brain relate to art.

At the turn of the century, Vienna was the cultural capital of Europe. The nobility adored their horses, their wine and their women utilizing the talents of "Jewish" physicians to cure them of the syphilis contracted from forays to escape their ennui. The Kultur of Vienna was for the most part Jewish and the talent out of proportion from the general populace.

Artists and scientists met in glittering salons, where they freely exchanged ideas that led to revolutionary breakthroughs in psychology, brain science, literature, and art. Kandel demonstrates the world of 1900 Vienna to trace, in rich and rewarding detail, the ideas and advances made then, and their enduring influence today.

The Vienna School of Medicine led the way with its realization that truth lies hidden beneath the surface. That principle infused Viennese culture and strongly influenced the other pioneers of Vienna 1900. Sigmund Freud shocked the world with his insights into how our everyday unconscious aggressive and erotic desires are repressed and disguised in symbols, dreams, and behavior. Arthur Schnitzler, a physician who became the most important playwright of his time revealed women's unconscious sexuality in his novels through his innovative use of the interior monologue. Gustav Klimt, whose gilt painting of Adele Bauer was purchased a few years ago by Ronald Lauder and paid an exorbitant amount of money. He viewed it when he was 13 and never quite got over that. [I waited on the hottest day in August 1999 for 45 minutes outside the Neue Gallery in Manhattan (owned by Lauder) to view this magnificent larger than life portrait. It was worth it.]

Kandel tells the story of how these pioneers—Freud, Schnitzler, Klimt, Kokoschka, and Schiele—inspired by the Vienna School of Medicine, in turn influenced the founders of the Vienna School of Art History to ask pivotal questions such as: What does the viewer bring to a work of art? How does the beholder respond to it? These questions prompted new and ongoing discoveries in psychology and brain biology, leading to revelations about how we see and perceive, how we think and feel, and how we respond to and create works of art. Kandel, one of the leading scientific thinkers of our time, places these five innovators in the context of today's cutting-edge science and gives us a new understanding of the modernist art of Klimt, Kokoschka, and Schiele, as well as the school of thought of Freud and Schnitzler ["La Ronde" is an adaptation of his play that was made into a film in the early 50's; many of the actors and various contributors – who escaped the Nazi onslaught – were Jewish, half Jewish, married to a Jew etc. This was Vienna before the world went mad].

Eric R. Kandel is Kavli Professor and University Professor at Columbia University and senior investigator at the Howard Hughes Medical Institute. He received the Nobel Prize in Physiological Medicine in 2000 for his work on memory storage in the brain. He lives in New York City.
