

Rabbi's Message

A new study suggests that joining a religious group could do more for someone's "sustained happiness" than other forms of social participation, such as volunteering, playing sports or taking a class.

A study in the American Journal of Epidemiology by researchers at the London School of Economics and Erasmus University Medical Center in the Netherlands found that the secret to sustained happiness lies in participation in religion.

"Organized religion appears to play a very important social role in keeping depression at bay and also as a coping mechanism during periods of illness in later life," Mauricio Avendano, an epidemiologist at LSE and an author of the study, said in a statement. "It is not clear to us how much this is about religion per se, or whether it may be about the sense of belonging and not being socially isolated."

Researchers looked at four areas: 1) volunteering or working with a charity; 2) taking educational courses; 3) participating in religious organizations; 4) participating in a political or community organization. Of the four, participating in a religious organization was the only social activity associated with sustained happiness, researchers found.

The study analyzed 9,000 Europeans who were older than 50. The report that studied older Europeans also found that joining political or community organizations lost their benefits over time. In fact, the short-term benefits from those social connections often lead to depressive symptoms later on, researchers say.

Although healthier people are more likely to volunteer, the researchers found no evidence that volunteering actually leads to better mental health. Benefits could be outweighed by other negative impacts of volunteering, such as stress, Avendano said.

The researchers noted that it is unclear whether the benefits of participating in a religious organization are connected to being in the religious community, or to the faith itself. Of course, that finding reminds me of the old story about Goldberg and Schwartz: One Shabbas morning, at the door to the synagogue, the rabbi says to Goldberg, "Goldberg! See nice to see you! It's been awhile, but I'm glad you came to be with us!" And

Goldberg replies, "That's not why I'm here. I'm here for Schwartz. Schwartz came to talk to God. And I came to talk to Schwartz."

(I think that, secretly, Goldberg came for more than just talking to Schwartz – which he could do anywhere.)

I find all this fascinating.

Tacked up above my desk in my office at Hebrew Union College is this little gem: "Religion taken seriously is the most liberating thing there is. Everything superfluous fades away." Isn't that true? Then there's this from the wonderful Jewish educator, Dr. Ron Wolfson: "When I enter the sanctuary surrounded by my community, lifting my voice in song of praise or meditating silently on the issues that confront me in my life, I am called to consider once again my role as God's partner in the work of creation. The words of the prayers are reminders of what that means: to care for the less fortunate, to fight injustice, to remember that I, too, was once a slave, to support and build the community, to study for myself, to heal the ill, to comfort the mourner, to repair the world. With every step I take on my Jewish journey, I have the power to make the world a better place, to help realize God's reign on earth."

Where else, really, is such an experience possible?

Maybe you come "to talk to Schwartz." Maybe you just come for the respite, for an hour's oasis in time and space when the quiet washes over you and calms your soul. Maybe you come to be lifted out of the mundane, the everyday, and the superfluous and to be reminded of what's truly important – relationships, history, values, comfort, challenge, continuity, covenant and inspiration. Maybe you come because your heart soars when you sing. Maybe you come because ... you can fill in the rest.

I hope that you'll keep coming.
